Welcome to the Annual Report for 2022. It's been quite a year for Regent College! We've celebrated our 40th Anniversary, which is no small feat. It's amazing that Regent College started as a grassroots movement by parents and families seeking options for faith-based education. Faith Christian Academy commenced in 1982 in Brisbane Street Perth and was subsequently renamed Rhema Christian Academy. The school relocated to its current site in Victoria Park in 1986. Since this time, our facilities and resources have grown considerably. The College refurbishment programme continued throughout 2022, with both Pre-Primary classrooms and the canteen updated and improved.

We celebrated the 40th Anniversary in staggered events throughout the year. Although the COVID-19 pandemic somewhat scuttled our plans, our joy and gratefulness remained intact. In Term 1, we held mini celebrations in each classroom due to the restrictions at the time. By Term 3, we were able to host an in-person event for alumni in September on the school grounds.

Over the years, the College has sought to stand out in the local and broader educational community. Our point of difference continues to be an intentionally caring community. This culture is strengthened by having Christian Staff and faith-influenced teaching practices. I was particularly grateful that we emerged from the pandemic with minimal staffing changes and consistency for students.

Our college has continued to grow, with a second Year 4 class added in 2022. Beginning in 2024, we anticipate double-streamed classes from Preprimary through to Year 6. We introduced new programmes, including a collaboration with Oracy Australia, to raise the profile of oral language throughout the College. We have modified events such as the Edudance concert and Easter Assembly to include live streaming for parents. Propelled by COVID requirements, we have increased our technology resources and programmes for communication and learning.

I am inspired by the following words by the Apostle Paul when facing everyday challenges, which underpin our core values of courage, honesty, respect, responsibility, and compassion.

So, chosen by God for this new life of love, dress in the wardrobe God picked out for you: compassion, kindness, humility, quiet strength, discipline.....And regardless of what else you put on, wear love. It's your basic, all-purpose garment. Never be without it. (Colossians 3:12,14 The Message)

Teacher Standards

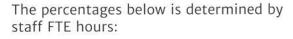

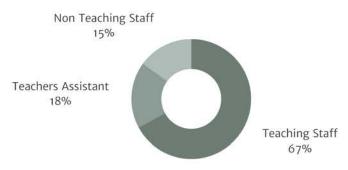
Workforce Composition

Staff Retention

The proportion of staff retained from 2021 to 2022 was 83%.

A major contribution to the lower retention was due to end of employment contracts and retirement.

Regent College is a co-educational, interdenominational Christian Primary School catering for students from Kindergarten to Year 6. The College aims to provide its students with the highest level of academic skills, skills that are foundational to lifelong learning and the achievement of individual potential. Support is given to students in developing a biblical worldview and emphasises the importance of growing in sound character based on Christian values. Regent has an experienced, dedicated staff and supportive community members who work collaboratively to achieve the best possible outcomes for the Regent learning community.

The student population (K-Y6) included approximately 51% of students having a Language Background Other than English (LBOTE) and 25 with learning difficulties.

The annual student attendance report completed in Term 3 2022, indicated an overall student attendance rate of 92.45% for students enrolled in Years 1–6.

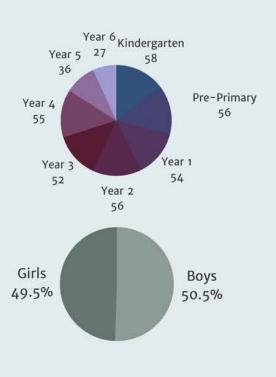
Attendance Management

National Assessment Program Literacy And Numeracy

This nationwide measurement of student development of literacy and numeracy skills provides parents, caregivers, teachers and school leaders with information on the performance of individual students in relation to national benchmarks standards.

At Regent College, we aim to continue to improve our standards for all students and aim for higher levels of competency in literacy and numeracy. NAPLAN is one tool that can be utilised to measure improvement, not only for the individual student but also for the effectiveness of our teaching and learning programs. This ensures we are providing the best possible outcomes for each student.

In 2022, Regent College had a 99% participation rate in the five assessment tasks; reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy.

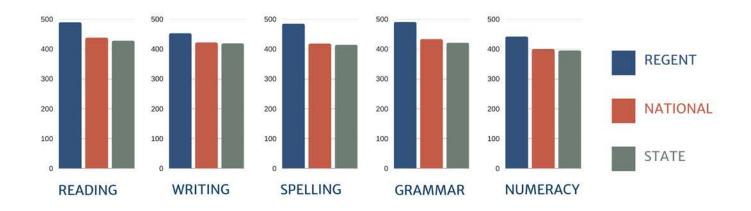

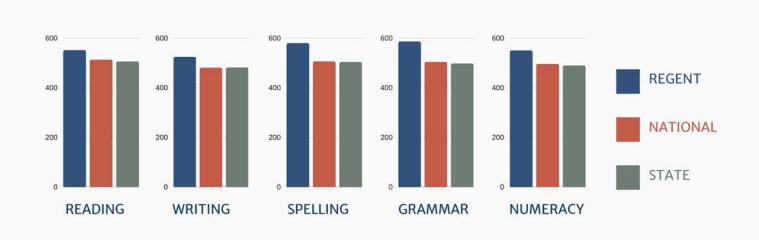

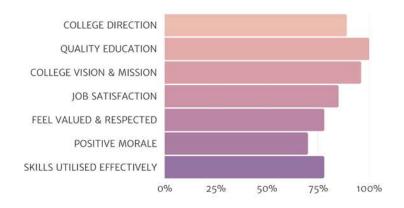


COLLEGE SATISFACTION

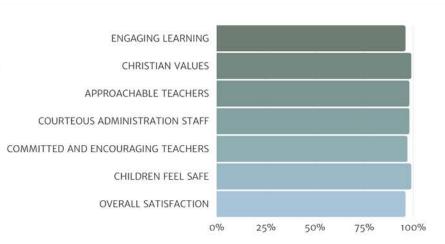


Staff Comments
